With over 1000 New Testament "commands", some of which are given redundantly and are therefore not all mentioned by reference, one needs to consider reading such things.

There are about 800 listings provided below for the new testament. At the end I list the commonly, BUT LIMITED VIEW, "613 commandments" of Torah. I also provide some of the death penalty sins in the Bible, and commands of Yahshua the Messiah. I warn you that this is indeed limited and you need to put forth the effort to read and study the Bible for YOURSELF! Please feel free to comment if you see we need to add anything. Understand, some commands one might read in this list were part of the sacrificial system "ADDED" "until the time of reformation", the coming of Messiah. Not to refrain from making a loan to a poor man, because of the release of loans in the Sabbatical year (Deut. 15:9)

To assemble the people to hear the Torah at the close of the seventh year (Deut. 31:12)

To count the years of the Jubilee by years and by cycles of seven years (Lev. 25:8)

To keep the Jubilee year holy by resting and letting the land lie fallow (Lev. 25:10)

This is in ADDITION to the Sabbatical years. A Jubilee is every 49 years.

Not to cultivate the soil nor do any work on the trees, in the Jubilee Year (Lev. 25:11)

Not to reap the aftermath of the field that grew of itself in the Jubilee Year, in the same way as in other years (Lev. 25:11)

Not to gather the fruit of the tree in the Jubilee Year, in the same way as in other years (Lev. 25:11)

To grant redemption to the land in the Jubilee year (Lev. 25:24)

The Court and Judicial Procedure

To appoint judges and officers in every community of Israyl (Deut. 16:18)

Not to appoint as a judge, a person who is not well versed in the laws of the Torah, even if he is expert in other branches of knowledge (Deut. 1:17)

To adjudicate cases of purchase and sale (Lev. 25:14)

To judge cases of liability of a paid depositary (Ex. 22:9)

To adjudicate cases of loss for which a gratuitous borrower is liable (Ex. 22:13-14)

To adjudicate cases of inheritances (Num. 27:8-11)

To judge cases of damage caused by an uncovered pit (Ex. 21:33-34)

To judge cases of injuries caused by beasts (Ex. 21:35-36)

To adjudicate cases of damage caused by trespass of cattle (Ex. 22:4)

To adjudicate cases of damage caused by fire (Ex. 22:5)

To adjudicate cases of damage caused by a gratuitous depositary (Ex. 22:6-7)

To adjudicate other cases between a plaintiff and a defendant (Ex. 22:8)

Not to curse a judge (Ex. 22:27)

That one who possesses evidence shall testify in Court (Lev. 5:1

Not to testify falsely (Ex. 20:13)

That a witness, who has testified in a capital case, shall not lay down the law in that particular case (Num. 35:30)

That a transgressor shall not testify (Ex. 23:1)

That the court shall not accept the testimony of a close relative of the defendant in matters of capital punishment (Deut. 24:16)

Not to hear one of the parties to a suit in the absence of the other party (Ex. 23:1)

To examine witnesses thoroughly (Deut. 13:15)

Not to decide a case on the evidence of a single witness (Deut. 19:15)

To give the decision according to the majority, when there is a difference of opinion as to matters of law (Ex. 23:2)

Not to decide, in capital cases, according to the view of the majority, when those who are for condemnation exceed by one only, those who are for acquittal (Ex. 23:2)

That, in capital cases, one who had argued for acquittal, shall not later on argue for condemnation (Ex. 23:2

To treat parties in a litigation with equal impartiality (Lev. 19:15)

Not to render iniquitous decisions (Lev. 19:15)

Not to favor a great man when trying a case (Lev. 19:15)

Not to take a bribe (Ex. 23:8)

Not to be afraid of a bad man, when trying a case (Deut. 1:17)

Not to be moved in trying a case, by the poverty of one of the parties (Ex. 23:3; Lev. 19:15)

Not to pervert the judgment of strangers or orphans (Deut. 24:17)

Not to pervert the judgment of a sinner (a person poor in fulfillment of commandments) (Ex. 23:6)

Not to render a decision on one's personal opinion, but only on the evidence of two witnesses, who saw what actually occurred (Ex. 23:7)

Not to execute one guilty of a capital offense, before he has stood his trial (Num. 35:12)

To accept the rulings of the SUPREME Court of the land your case is in (Deut. 17:11)

Not to rebel against the orders of the Court (Deut. 17:11)

To make a parapet for your roof, if it's a flat roof, usually. (Deut. 22:8) (to protect one from falling off)

Not to leave something that might cause hurt (Deut. 22:8)

To save the pursued even at the cost of the life of the pursuer (Deut. 25:12)

Not to spare a pursuer, but he is to be slain before he reaches the pursued and slays the latter, or uncovers his nakedness (Deut. 25:12) (i.e. stop vigilante justice)

Property and Property Rights

Not to sell a field in perpetuity (Lev. 25:23)

Not to change the character of the open land (about the cities of) the Levites or of their fields; not to sell it in perpetuity, but it may be redeemed at any time (Lev. 25:34)

That houses sold within a walled city may be redeemed within a year (Lev. 25:29)

Not to remove accurate landmarks (property boundaries) (Deut. 19:14)

Not to swear falsely in denial of another's property rights (Lev. 19:11)

Not to deny falsely another's property rights (Lev. 19:11)

Never to settle in the land of Egypt (Deut. 17:16)

Not to steal personal property (Lev. 19:11)

To restore that which one took by robbery (Lev. 5:23)

To return lost property (Deut. 22:1)

Not to pretend not to have seen lost property, to avoid the obligation to return it (Deut. 22:3)

Criminal Laws

Not to slay an innocent person (Ex. 20:13)

Not to kidnap any person of Israyl (Ex. 20:13) (this verse refers to stealing a person, distinguished from

Lev. 19:11, regarding the taking of property)

Not to rob by violence (Lev. 19:13)

Not to defraud (Lev. 19:13)

Not to covet what belongs to another (Ex. 20:14)

Not to crave something that belongs to another (Deut. 5:18)

Not to indulge in evil thoughts and sights (Num. 15:39)

Punishment and Restitution

That the Court shall pass sentence of death by decapitation with the sword (Ex. 21:20; Lev. 26:25)

That the Court shall pass sentence of death by strangulation (Lev. 20:10)

That the Court shall pass sentence of death by burning with fire (Lev. 20:14)

That the Court shall pass sentence of death by stoning (Deut. 22:24)

To hang the dead body of one who has incurred that penalty (Deut. 21:22)

That the dead body of an executed criminal shall not remain hanging on the tree over night (Deut. 21:23)

To inter the executed on the day of execution (Deut. 21:23)

Not to accept ransom from a murderer (Num. 35:31)

To exile one who committed accidental homicide (Num. 35:25)

To establish six cities of refuge (for those who committed accidental homicide) (Deut. 19:3)

Not to settle idolaters in our land (Ex. 23:33)

To slay the inhabitants of a city that has become idolatrous and burn that city (Deut. 13:16-17)

Not to rebuild a city that has been led astray to idolatry (Deut. 13:17)

Not to make use of the property of city that has been so led astray (Deut. 13:18)

Agriculture and Animal Husbandry

Not to cross-breed cattle of different species (Lev. 19:19)

Not to sow different kinds of seed together in one field (Lev. 19:19)

Not to eat the fruit of a tree for three years from the time it was planted (Lev. 19:23)

That the fruit of fruit-bearing trees in the fourth year of their planting shall be sacred (Lev. 19:24)

Not to sow grain or herbs in a vineyard (Deut. 22:9)

Not to eat the produce of diverse seeds sown in a vineyard (Deut. 22:9)

Not to work with beasts of different species, yoked together (Deut. 22:10)

Clothing

That a man shall not wear women's clothing (Deut. 22:5)

That a woman should not wear men's clothing (Deut. 22:5)

Many take the two above verses to apply to garments of warfare.

Not to wear garments made of wool and linen mixed together (Deut. 22:11)

Some suggest the mixing of materials should not be practiced regardless of types of materials.

The Firstborn

To redeem the firstborn human male (Ex. 13:13; Ex. 34:20; Num. 18:15)

To redeem the firstling of an ass (Ex. 13:13; Ex. 34:20)

To break the neck of the firstling of an ass if it is not redeemed (Ex. 13:13; Ex. 34:20)

Not to redeem the firstling of a clean beast (Num. 18:17)

Kohanim and Levites

That the kohanim shall put on priestly vestments for the service (Ex. 28:2)

Not to tear the High Kohein's robe (Ex. 28:32)

That the kohein shall not enter the Sanctuary at all times (i.e., at times when he is not performing service) (Lev. 16:2)

That the ordinary kohein shall not defile himself by contact with any dead, other than immediate relatives (Lev. 21:1-3)

That the kohanim defile themselves for their deceased relatives (by attending their burial), and mourn for them like other Israylites, who are commanded to mourn for their relatives (Lev. 21:3)

That a kohein who had an immersion during the day (to cleanse him from his uncleanness) shall not serve in the Sanctuary until after sunset (Lev. 21:6)

That a kohein shall not marry a divorced woman (Lev. 21:7)

That a kohein shall not marry a harlot (Lev. 21:7)

That a kohein shall not marry a profaned woman (Lev. 21:7)

To show honor to a kohein, and to give him precedence in all things that are holy (Lev. 21:8)

That a High Kohein shall not defile himself with any dead, even if they are relatives (Lev. 21:11)

That a High Kohein shall not go (under the same roof) with a dead body (Lev. 21:11) It has been learnt by tradition that a kohein, who does so, violates the prohibition, "Neither shall he go in ", and also the prohibition "He shall not defile himself"

That the High Kohein shall marry a virgin (Lev. 21:13)

That the High Kohein shall not marry a widow (Lev. 21:14)

That the High Kohein shall not cohabit with a widow, even without marriage, because he profanes her (Lev. 21:15):17) (negative).

That a kohein with a temporary blemish shall not serve there (Lev. 21:21)

That a person with a physical blemish shall not enter the Sanctuary further than the altar (Lev. 21:23)

That a kohein who is unclean shall not serve (in the Sanctuary) (Lev. 22:2-3)

To send the unclean out of the Camp of the Shechinah, that is, out of the Sanctuary (Num. 5:2)

That a kohein who is unclean shall not enter the courtyard (Num. 5:2-3) This refers to the Camp of the Shechinah

That the kohanim shall bless Israyl (Num. 6:23)

To set apart a portion of the dough for the kohein (Num. 15:20)

That the Levites shall not occupy themselves with the service that belongs to the kohanim, nor the kohanim with that belonging to the Levites (Num. 18:3)

That one not a descendant of Aaron in the male line shall not serve (in the Sanctuary) (Num. 18:4-7)

That the Levite shall serve in the Sanctuary (Num. 18:23)

To give the Levites cities to dwell in, these to serve also as cities of refuge (Num. 35:2)

That none of the tribe of Levi shall take any portion of territory in the land (of Israyl) (Deut. 18:1)

That none of the tribe of Levi shall take any share of the spoil (at the conquest of the Promised Land) (Deut. 18:1)

That the kohanim shall serve in the Sanctuary in divisions, but on festivals, they all serve together (Deut. 18:6-8)

T'rumah, Tithes and Taxes

Remember, some elements of the commands, SOME CLAIM, have passed from the Levites, or at the temple in Jerusalem, to YOUR DINING TABLE IN THE HOLY PLACE OF YOUR HOME ... your altar or your TEMPLE, your body, which has connection to the environ you are to be in contact with, which would include an altar (often your dinning table or particular dedicated altar or "stonehenge/altar" for spiritual communion of the Heavenly Host ... YOU being, as a believer, of the MALKI-TZEDEK priesthood ... "Melchizedek" (erroneously at times "Adonizedek" in the claimed modern Book of Jasher ... where he is SHEM, "King of Jerusalem" 16:11.)

Hebrews (7:13-17) Yahshua the Messiah is considered a priest in the order of Melchizedek. Some would conclude ALL, male and female, pure True Israylite BELIEVERS, become part of this priesthood by simple connection of the union of Messiah and the believer in the Spirit. Others may limit it to the man of the household of faith, as women's position in the hierarchy of authority would connect her via the male "head" over her.

That an uncircumcised person shall not eat of the t'rumah (heave offering), and the same applies to other holy things. This rule is inferred from the law of the Paschal offering, by similarity of phrase (Ex. 12:44-45 and Lev. 22:10) but it is not explicitly set forth in the Torah. Traditionally, it has been learnt that the rule that the uncircumcised must not eat holy things is an essential principle of the Torah and not an enactment of the Scribes. Yet, remember a TRUE ISRAYLITE BELIEVER OF NECESSITY MUST BE CIRCUMCISED IN HEART, which is STILL COMMANDED. Paul clearly tells us circumcision of the flesh is ALSO a "commandment of Yahweh", 1 Cor. 7:19. While physical circumcision is not our salvation, it is certainly clearly commanded for men, if for nothing else, a GENETIC MESSAGE SIGN. Those that study know, the Bible is a genetic, racial covenant to a "chosen race" of a "holy seed". A "sperma", seed, that travel through the penis of the chosen race of ADAMITES, specifically ISRAYLITES.

Not to alter the order of separating the t'rumah and the tithes; the separation be in the order first-fruits at the beginning, then the t'rumah, then the first tithe, and last the second tithe (Ex. 22:28)

To give half a shekel every year (to the Sanctuary for provision of the public sacrifices) (Ex. 30:13)

That a kohein who is unclean shall not eat of the t'rumah (Lev. 22:3-4)

That a person who is not a kohein or the wife or unmarried daughter of a kohein shall not eat of the t'rumah (Lev. 22:10)

That a sojourner with a kohein or his hired servant shall not eat of the t'rumah (Lev. 22:10)

Not to eat tevel (something from which the t'rumah and tithe have not yet been separated) (Lev. 22:15)

To set apart the tithe of the produce (one tenth of the produce after taking out t'rumah) for the Levites (Lev. 27:30; Num. 18:24)

To tithe cattle (Lev. 27:32)

Not to sell the tithe of the herd (Lev. 27:32-33)

That the Levites shall set apart a tenth of the tithes, which they had received from the Israylites, and give it to the kohanim (called the t'rumah of the tithe) (Num. 18:26)

Not to eat the second tithe of cereals outside thy gates (Deut. 12:17)

Not to consume the second tithe of the vintage outside of thy gates (Deut. 12:17)

Not to consume the second tithe of the oil outside of thy gates (Deut. 12:17)

Not to forsake the Levites (Deut. 12:19); but their gifts (dues) should be given to them, so that they might

rejoice therewith on each and every festival

To set apart the second tithe in the first, second, fourth and fifth years of the sabbatical cycle to be eaten by its owner (Deut. 14:22)

To set apart the second tithe in the third and sixth year of the sabbatical cycle for the poor (Deut. 14:28-29)

To give the kohein the due portions of the carcass of cattle (Deut. 18:3)

To give the first of the fleece to the kohein (Deut. 18:4)

To set apart t'rumah g'dolah (the great heave-offering, that is, a small portion of the grain, wine and oil) for the kohein (Deut. 18:4)

Not to expend the proceeds of the second tithe on anything but food and drink (Deut. 26:14). Anything outside of things necessary for sustenance comes within the class in the phrase "Given for the dead" Not to eat the Second Tithe, even in Jerusalem, in a state of uncleanness, until the tithe had been redeemed (Deut. 26:14)

Not to eat the Second Tithe, when mourning (Deut. 26:14)

To make the declaration, when bringing the second tithe to the Sanctuary (Deut. 26:13)

The Temple, the Sanctuary and Sacred Objects

Not to build an altar of hewn stone (Ex. 20:22)

Not to mount the altar by steps (Ex. 20:23)

To build the Sanctuary (Ex. 25:8)

Not to remove the staves from the Ark (Ex. 25:15)

To set the showbread and the frankincense before Yahweh every Shabbat (Ex. 25:30)

To kindle lights in the Sanctuary (Ex. 27:21)

That the breastplate shall not be loosened from the ephod (Ex. 28:28)

To offer up incense twice daily (Ex. 30:7)

Not to offer strange incense nor any sacrifice upon the golden altar (Ex. 30:9)

That the kohein shall wash his hands and feet at the time of service (Ex. 30:19)

To prepare the oil of anointment and anoint high kohanim and kings with it (Ex. 30:31)

Not to compound oil for lay use after the formula of the anointing oil (Ex. 30:32-33)

Not to anoint a stranger with the anointing oil (Ex. 30:32)

Not to compound anything after the formula of the incense (Ex. 30:37)

That he who, in error, makes unlawful use of sacred things, shall make restitution of the value of his trespass and add a fifth (Lev. 5:16)

To remove the ashes from the altar (Lev. 6:3)

To keep fire always burning on the altar of the burnt-offering (Lev. 6:6)

Not to extinguish the fire on the altar (Lev. 6:6)

That a kohein shall not enter the Sanctuary with disheveled hair (Lev. 10:6)

That a kohein shall not enter the Sanctuary with torn garments (Lev. 10:6)

That the kohein shall not leave the Courtyard of the Sanctuary, during service (Lev. 10:7)

That an intoxicated person shall not enter the Sanctuary nor give decisions in matters of the Law (Lev. 10:9-11)

To revere the Sanctuary (Lev. 19:30) (YOUR BODY is the Temple. And if you have a dinning table or holy place you keep special ... REVERE IT WELL!)

That when the Ark is carried, it should be carried on the shoulder (Num. 7:9)

To observe the second Passover (Num. 9:11)

To eat the flesh of the Paschal lamb on it, with unleavened bread and bitter herbs (Num. 9:11; 1 Cor. 5:7-8)

Not to leave any flesh of the Paschal lamb brought on the second Passover until the morning (Num. 9:12)

Not to break a bone of the Paschal lamb brought on the second Passover (Num. 9:12)

To sound the trumpets at the offering of sacrifices and in times of trouble (Num. 10:9-10)

To watch over the edifice continually (Num. 18:2)

Not to allow the Sanctuary to remain unwatched (Num. 18:5)

That an offering shall be brought by one who has in error committed a trespass against sacred things, or robbed, or lain carnally with a bond-maid betrothed to a man, or denied what was deposited with him and swore falsely to support his denial. This is called a guilt-offering for a known trespass.

Not to destroy anything of the Sanctuary, or of houses of study, nor erase the holy names (of Yahweh or Yahshua); nor may sacred scriptures be destroyed (Deut. 12:2-4)

To sanctify the firstling of clean cattle and offer it up (Ex. 13:2; Deut. 15:19)

To slay the Paschal lamb (Ex. 12:6)

To eat the flesh of the Paschal sacrifice on the night of the fifteenth of Nissan (Ex. 12:8) (So, kill it around noon to 3 p.m. on the 14th of the first month, skin and prep, roast it in time to eat it after sundown on the beginning of the 15th, A SABBATH.)

Not to eat the flesh of the Paschal lamb raw or sodden (Ex. 12:9)

Not to leave any portion of the flesh of the Paschal sacrifice until the morning unconsumed (Ex. 12:10) (So, well after midnight, you arise before sun up, or before "morning" and burn the remains.)

Not to give the flesh of the Paschal lamb to an Israylite who had become an apostate (Ex. 12:43)

Not to give flesh of the Paschal lamb to a stranger who lives among you to eat (Ex. 12:45)

Not to take any of the flesh of the Paschal lamb from the company's place of assembly (Ex. 12:46)

Not to break a bone of the Paschal lamb (Ex. 12:46)

That the uncircumcised shall not eat of the flesh of the Paschal lamb (Ex. 12:48)

Not to slaughter the Paschal lamb while there is chametz (leaven) in the home (Ex. 23:18; Ex. 24:25)

Not to leave the part of the Paschal lamb that should be burnt on the altar until the morning, when it will no longer be fit to be burnt (Ex. 23:18; Ex. 24:25)

Not to go up to the Sanctuary for the festival without bringing an offering (Ex. 23:15)

To bring the first fruits to the Sanctuary (Ex. 23:19)

That the flesh of a sin-offering and guilt-offering shall be eaten (Ex. 29:33)

That one not of the seed of Aaron, shall not eat the flesh of the holy sacrifices (Ex. 29:33)

To observe the procedure of the burnt-offering (Lev. 1:3)

To observe the procedure of the meal-offering (Lev. 2:1)

Not to offer up leaven or honey (Lev. 2:11)

That every sacrifice be salted (Lev. 2:13) (EVERY BITE you put in your TEMPLE should be part of a SALT COVENANT.)

Not to offer up any offering unsalted (Lev. 2:13)

That the Court of Judgment shall offer up a sacrifice if they have erred in a judicial pronouncement (Lev. 4:13)

That an individual shall bring a sin-offering if he has sinned in error by committing a transgression, the conscious violation of which is punished with excision (Lev. 4:27-28)

To offer a sacrifice of varying value in accordance with one's means (Lev. 5:7)

Not to sever completely the head of a fowl brought as a sin-offering (Lev. 5:8)

Not to put olive oil in a sin-offering made of flour (Lev. 5:11)

Not to put frankincense on a sin-offering made of flour (Lev. 5:11)

That an individual shall bring an offering if he is in doubt as to whether he has committed a sin for which one has to bring a sin-offering. This is called a guilt-offering for doubtful sins (Lev. 5:17-19)

That the remainder of the meal offerings shall be eaten (Lev. 6:9)

Not to allow the remainder of the meal offerings to become leavened (Lev. 6:10)

That the High Kohein shall offer a meal offering daily (Lev. 6:13)

Not to eat of the meal offering brought by the kohanim (Lev. 6:16)

To observe the procedure of the sin-offering (Lev. 6:18)

Not to eat of the flesh of sin offerings, the blood of which is brought within the Sanctuary and sprinkled towards the Veil (Lev. 6:23)

To observe the procedure of the guilt-offering (Lev. 7:1)

To observe the procedure of the peace-offering (Lev. 7:11)

To burn meat of the holy sacrifice that has remained over (Lev. 7:17)

Not to eat of sacrifices that are eaten beyond the appointed time for eating them (Lev. 7:18) The penalty is excision.

Not to eat of holy things that have become unclean (Lev. 7:19)

To burn meat of the holy sacrifice that has become unclean (Lev. 7:19)

That a person who is unclean shall not eat of things that are holy (Lev. 7:20)

A kohein's daughter who profaned herself shall not eat of the holy things, neither of the heave offering nor of the breast, nor of the shoulder of peace offerings (Lev. 10:14, Lev. 22:12)

That a woman after childbirth shall bring an offering when she is clean (Lev. 12:6)

That the leper shall bring a sacrifice after he is cleansed (Lev. 14:10)

That a man having an issue shall bring a sacrifice after he is cleansed of his issue (Lev. 15:13-15)

That a woman having an issue shall bring a sacrifice after she is cleansed of her issue (Lev. 15:28-30)

To observe, on Yom Kippur, the service appointed for that day, regarding the sacrifice, confessions, sending away of the scapegoat, etc. (Lev. 16:3-34)

Not to slaughter beasts set apart for sacrifices outside (the Sanctuary/Your Holy Place) (Lev. 17:3-4)

Not to eat flesh of a sacrifice that has been left over (beyond the time appointed for its consumption) (Lev. 19:8)

Not to sanctify blemished cattle for sacrifice on the altar (Lev. 22:20) This text prohibits such beasts being set apart for sacrifice on the altar.

That every animal offered up shall be without blemish (Lev. 22:21)

That one who vows to Yahweh the monetary value of a person shall pay the amount appointed in the Scriptural portion (Lev. 27:2-8)

If a beast is exchanged for one that had been set apart as an offering, both become sacred (Lev. 27:10) Not to exchange a beast set aside for sacrifice (Lev. 27:10)

That one who vows to Yahweh the monetary value of an unclean beast shall pay its value (Lev. 27:11-13) That one who vows the value of his house shall pay according to the appraisal of the kohein (Lev. 27:11-13)

That one who sanctifies to Yahweh a portion of his field shall pay according to the estimation appointed in the Scriptural portion (Lev. 27:16-24)

Not to transfer a beast set apart for sacrifice from one class of sacrifices to another (Lev. 27:26)

To decide in regard to dedicated property as to which is sacred to Yahweh and which belongs to the kohein (Lev. 27:28)

Not to sell a field devoted to Yahweh (Lev. 27:28)

Not to redeem a field devoted to Yahweh (Lev. 27:28)

To make confession before Yahweh of any sin that one has committed, when bringing a sacrifice and at other times (Num. 5:6-7)

Not to put olive oil in the meal-offering of a woman suspected of adultery (Num. 5:15)

Not to put frankincense on it (Num. 5:15)

To offer up the regular sacrifices daily (two lambs as burnt offerings) (Num. 28:3)

To offer up an additional sacrifice every Shabbat (two lambs) (Num. 28:9)

To offer up an additional sacrifice every New Moon (Num. 28:11)

To bring an additional offering on Shavu'ot (Num. 28:26-27)

To offer up an additional sacrifice on Rosh Hashanah (Num. 29:1-6)

To offer up an additional sacrifice on Yom Kippur (Num. 29:7-8)

To offer up an additional sacrifice on Sukkot (Num. 29:12-34)

To offer up an additional offering on Shemini Atzeret, which is a festival by itself (Num. 29:35-38)

To bring all offerings, whether obligatory or freewill, on the first festival after these were incurred (Deut. 12:5-6)

Not to offer up sacrifices outside (the Sanctuary/the Holy Place) (Deut. 12:13)

That eight species of creeping things defile by contact (Lev. 11:29-30)

That foods become defiled by contact with unclean things (Lev. 11:34)

That anyone who touches the carcass of a beast that died of itself shall be unclean (Lev. 11:39)

That a lying-in woman is unclean like a menstruating woman (in terms of uncleanness) (Lev. 12:2-5)

That a leper is unclean and defiles (Lev. 13:2-46)

Both "old" and "new" testaments list many sins that always damn the soul and cause one to incur the eternal death penalty (Jer. 23; Ezek. 3, 18, 33; Mark 7:19-21; Romans 1:18-32; 1 Cor. 5:9-11; Gal. 5:19-21; Col. 3:5-10; 2 Peter 2; Jude 3-19).

The SAME SINS condemned by Moses writings are in various ways condemned in the later writers.

In Jer. 15:10, as he is reasoning why he does not deserve death or slavery due to Babylon's invasion he makes emphasis to the fact he had never paid usury nor charged it to others. Suggesting it may have been viewed by some as a death penalty sin.

COMMANDS OF YAHSHUA

- 1. Repent and believe in the Good Tidings (Matt 3:2, Mark 1:15) Note: the first word recorded in Yahshua's ministry was "REPENT". Obviously, this would have to mean repent of something and the only logical conclusion would be repent from the law given to the people the promised good tidings and LAW are directed to, True genetic stock Israyl. Sin is the transgression of the law, 1 John 3:4. Transgressing the law is what stops the mouths and finds the people guilty, Roman 3:19. The law is what establishes "sound doctrine", and is part of the TRUE GOSPEL, 1 Timothy 1:8-11. Any "gospel" claiming the law given at Mt. Horeb is "done away" is "another gospel", 2 Corinthians 11:4. Those promoting such "another gospel", as christianity does, "accursed", Galatians 1:8 AND 9. You should also note, the first reading Yahshua gives in is youth is from Isayah 61, which regards the "good tidings" that are exclusively directed at physical genetic stock Israyl, BOTH HOUSES. He came to House of Yahudah, commonly termed "jews", which predominantly rejected him, directly instrumental in his murder. The other sheep, the other flock, would be, at the time appointed, i.e. the end of the 70 weeks prophecy which ended in 34 A.D. with the stoning of Stephen, ministered to, as we find Phillip doing in Acts 8, right after the stoning of Stephen. We could easily translate such as "REPENT ISRAYL, AND BELIEVE THE GOOD TIDINGS PROMISED TO YOUR FATHERS, AND YOU!" He is not talking to mongrels, hottentots, pygmies, negroes, mongols, eskimoes, nor even non-Israylite whites. (Romans 9, 2 Esdras 6:54-59, Deut. 23:2, Ezra 9:2-10:3, 1 Peter 2:9-10,
- 2. Rejoice in trials and persecutions (Matt 5:12)
- 3. Do not think He came to destroy/abolish the law (Matt 5:17) Yet WHOLE religions are based upon this false teaching, including christianity.
- 4. Be more righteous than the Pharisees (Matt 5:20) Remember they were hypocrites. They also followed the "traditions of the elders" which "make void the commandments of Yahweh", ... as does christianity today.
- 5. Beware of the Danger of Anger (Matt 5:21-22) "Be angry and sin not".
- 6. Don't make an offering if there is unresolved sin (Matt 5:23-24) Don't even pray for your food until things are resolved?
- 7. Do not lust, or fantasize about committing any sin in your heart. (Matt. 5:27-28)
- 8. Put away the old man, put on the new man (Matt 5:29-30)
- 9. Do not divorce your spouse unless they are of "fornication" (Matt. 5:31-32) For example, the rulers of the people may have been mixed with Edomite stock, yet they claimed to not be "born of fornication". It can mean at times, miscegenation. This interpretation would agree with the instruction found in Ezra 10:3. The context of his meaning of "fornication" may be very broad and mean numerous things, including spiritual adultery against the head of the family ... some have claimed, rebellion against the husband.
- 10. Let your word alone have integrity, without needless swearing. (Matt. 5:33-37)
- 11. Do not resist an evil Israylite is particular matters (Matt. 5:39) This again is pointing at the law of Yahweh in Lev. 19:18 and is emphatic, "THY PEOPLE". See James 5:6.
- 12. With proper stewardship in mind, "give to those who ask." (Matt. 5:40-42) Again, context of the Bible is TO ISRAYL.
- 13. Love those who do not love you among Israyl, to be a child of Yahweh. (Matt. 5:43-48)
- 14. Don't give charity or pray to please men, do it to please Yahweh. (Matt. 6:1-4) Yet, one is not even to pray for some, so rightly divide such passages. You're not to be aiding and abetting the vermin, or beasts.
- 15. Don't use vain repetitions when praying. (Matt. 6:7-8) Perhaps like don't be "chanting" or "Hail Mary")
- 16. Pray "in this manner" that Yahshua prescribes. (Matt. 6:9-13)
- 17. "When you fast, don't appear unto men to be fasting." (Matt. 6:16-18)
- 18. "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, but treasures in heaven." (Matt. 6:19-21)
- 19. Judge not, that you be not judged. (Matt. 7:1-2) Yahweh has declared the judgment you live by.
- 20. Don't be a hypocrite. Remove sins from your life before trying to confront someone with sins in theirs. (Matt. 7:1-2)
- 21. Do not give what is holy to the dogs; nor cast your pearls before swine. (Matt. 7:6) Yahshua describes some as "dogs" and "swine". Do you?
- 22. Ask, and it will be given to you. (Matt. 7:7-8)
- 23. Enter the narrow gate. (Matt. 7:13-14)

- 24. Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are ravenous wolves. (Matt. 7:15-20) You should note, many of these will be rather religious or spiritually minded.
- 25. When Yahweh does a mighty work in your life, remember there is greater accountability (Matt. 10:11-
- 15; 12:41-45; Luke 12:49; John 15:22)
- 26. Be wise as serpents, harmless as doves (Matthew 10:16)
- 27. Beware of men (Matt. 10:17)
- 28. When brought before governing authorities, don't worry about how or what to speak. Yahweh's Spirit will give you the words to speak. (Matt. 10:18-20)
- 29. When evangelizing city to city, go to another city if you are being persecuted. (Matt. 10:23)
- 30. Do not fear man, fear Yahweh. (Matt. 10:26-28)
- 31. Never deny Yahshua or be ashamed of Him or His words. (Matt. 10:32-33)
- 32. Do not think that Yahshua came to bring peace, rather a sword. (Matt. 10:34-36) "DIVISION" too.
- 33. Love Yahshua more than anyone else, even more than your own family members. (Matt. 10:37)
- 34. Take up your torture stake and follow Him. (Matt. 10:38-39)
- 35. If you are labored and heavy laden, come to Yahshua and take His yoke upon you. (Matt 11:28-30)
- 36. Value peace and unity more than having your own way, and only make division where Yahweh makes division. (Matt. 12:25-27)
- 37. Walk with Yahshua, otherwise you are against Him. Gather with Him or you will be scattered. There is no middle ground. (Matt. 12:30)
- 38. Remember the danger of blaspheming the Holy Spirit, which is unforgivable. (Matt. 12:31) Recall Esau found no place of repentance for his having no respect of the birthright, his marriages outside of the covenant promised people, and lost that birthright to Jacob. To this day, his offspring are mongrels, forbidden in the congregation of Yahweh. Esau is Edom. Edomites were conquered by John Hyrcanus and unlawfully force converted to talmudic judaism. After that time those that called themselves "jews" were of the cursed line, and being called "jews". Obadyah the prophet promises their total demise at the hands of true Israyl. There will be a total death of these mongrel pretenders before things are finished in the prophetic time line. Disregard of the genetic right Yahweh granted to His white race of True Israyl is rather dangerous. Punishable by death in many instances. Based upon the record of Esau, and Yahweh's promise for ALL of his lineage, is it related to the blasphemy in question?
- 39. Remember you are justified or condemned by your words, so guard your heart. (Matt. 12:36-37)
- 40. When you see the work of Yahweh, don't seek a sign in an accusatory way. (Matt. 16:1-4)
- 41. If Yahweh delivers you from unclean spirits, or the works of unclean spirits in your life, make sure you don't provide an open and empty house for it to come right back in. (Matt. 12:43-45) Ask to be filled with the Holy Spirit of Yahweh.
- 42. Value the spiritual family Yahweh has given you. (Matt. 12:46-50)
- 43. When hearing Yahweh's Word, seek to be those who truly understand it. (Matt. 13:19)
- 44. Be willing to obey and be loyal to Yahweh at all costs whenever persecutions and trials come. (Matt. 13:19-20)
- 45. Don't get caught up in worldly things or the pursuit of earthly riches. (Matt. 13:22)
- 46. Judgment is coming. Humble yourself before Yahweh, repent and be buried with Messiah in baptism, walking in the newness of life in Him. (Matt.13:24-43)
- 47. To receive proper instruction concerning Yahweh's Kingdom, read the entire Bible, not just the "Old or New Testament." (Matt.13:52)
- 48. By faith, know that Yahweh can accomplish great things through you as you do all things in Yahshua's name/power/authority, and everyone will benefit from it. (Matt. 13:31-32)

- 50. Be willing to give up all earthly things to obtain the Kingdom riches. (Matt.13:44-46)
- 51. Do not get complacent in your spiritual walk. Always be zealous and ready to hear, and see, and allow Yahweh's Spirit to lead you into all truth, lest what you do have be taken away. (Matt. 13:12; 25:25-19)
- 52. When doing ministry work, don't expect acceptance from close friends and family, nor let their rejection deter you from doing what Yahweh called you to do. (Matt. 13:53-58)
- 53. Don't allow yourself to dismiss Yahweh's willingness to use people you are close to to do great works in

ministry. Rather, reject any unproven negative thoughts about the person. (Matt. 13:53-58)

- 54. When it comes to mighty works of the Spirit being done, remember that it's not just the faith of the one doing the works, but also the faith of those benefitting from the works that determine success. (Matt 13:58, Mark 5:34;10:52, Luke 17:19)
- 55. Do not labor for the food that perishes, but for the food (His Word) which endures to everlasting life. (John 6:27)
- 56. Do not murmur against Yahshua. Instead, study the true meaning of His Words rather than carelessly finding fault with them. (John 6:43-69)
- 57. Partake of the body and blood of Yahshua, symbolized by the unleavened bread and fruit of the vine, as part of a Passover service. (John 6:53-58; 1 Cor 5:7; 11:23-31)
- 58. To walk as He walked, wear the tassels (tzitziyot) on the four corners of your clothing as reminders to keep His Word. (Matt. 9:22,14:36; Mark 6:56)
- 59. Honor your parents by providing for their unmet needs as they age. (Matt. 15:4-6)
- 60. Do not follow traditions that violate commandments of Yahweh. (Matt 15:3,9)
- 61. Guard your heart against all evil, otherwise you will be defiled in Yahweh's eyes. (Matt. 15:19-20)
- 62. When sharing your faith, only follow Yahshua's example of harsh words to the scribes and Pharisees if it is the same situation: You are a prophet and are hearing the direct words from Yahweh, knowing the final destination of their soul. (Matt. 23:1-36; 15:12-14;, John 12:49-50)
- 63. In whatever Yahweh calls you do, for the most part stay on task rather than always operating in gifts He hasn't yet given. (Matt 10:56; 15:24-26)
- 64. Beware of the doctrines of the Pharisees/Sadducees, presently preserved in the Talmud. (Matt. 16:6-12)
- 65. Do not trade your soul for anything this world has to offer. (Matt. 16:24-26)
- 66. By faith, seek to understand the root cause of sickness/disease in a person and how to respond to it. It may or may not be a spirit; it may or may not be from a sin in one's life. (Matt. 17:14-21, Mark 2:9, James 5:16)
- 67. Follow Yahshua's example and endeavor not to offend people unnecessarily. If one finds your actions offensive, let it be your obedience to Yahweh that offends them. (Matt. 17:24-27)
- 68. Be humble as little children, or you will not enter kingdom of heaven. (Matt. 18:2-4)
- 69. Look for humble disciples of Yahshua who just want to serve and follow and keep His Commandments, and receive them. (Matt. 18:4-5)
- 70. To avoid great consequences, take heed that you do not despise a little one or cause them to stumble. (Matt. 18:6-10)
- 71. Do not despise the Israylite unbeliever, especially the more humble ones. Love them as Yahshua did and rejoice when they repent. (Matt. 18:6-10)
- 72. If an Israylite sins against you, go to them privately to see if he will hear you. The purpose is to gain your brother/sister. (Matt. 18:15-17)
- 73. If you have gone to an Israylite privately about their sin and they won't hear you, bring with you one or two others to try and bring them to repentance. (Matt. 18:15-17)
- 74. If you have gone to an Israylite privately about their sin and they won't hear you, and you have brought one or two others with you and they still won't hear you, bring them before the congregation in order to bring them to repentance. (Matt. 18:15-17)
- 75. If one has gone to an Israylite privately about their sin, brought with them one or two more, and brought the matter before the congregation but they still will not hear, regard that person to be an unbeliever. (Matt. 18:15-17)
- 76. If your brother/sister repents, forgive him from the heart. (Matt. 18:23-35)
- 77. Keep all of Yahweh's Commandments and put your trust in Yahshua for your righteousness. Otherwise, you will not inherit eternal life. (Matt. 19:16-17; John 14:6)
- 78. No one can serve two masters. Therefore, serve Yahweh rather than money or anything else. (Matt. 19:23-25; Luke 16:13-15)
- 79. When others receive a blessing, choose to rejoice rather than to demand fairness or allow envy and jealousy to enter your heart. (Matt. 20:1-16)
- 80. Don't turn Yahweh's house or any other place of ministry into a marketplace. (Matt. 21:12-13; John 2:13-17)

- 81. Praise from a pure, humble and innocent heart, without pretense, is perfected praise. Seek to give Yahweh the praise... that kind of praise. (Matt. 21:14-16)
- 82. Be willing to admit it when you are wrong, even to your own hurt and shame. (Matt. 21:23-32)
- 83. Make sure you have on the wedding garment, the fine linen of righteous acts through repentance, and the robe of righteousness that can only come from Yahshua. (Matt. 22:1-12; Isaiah 61:10; Rev. 7:7-10; 12:17; 14:12)
- 84. The jurisdiction mattering, pay what you owe due in taxes, for the tax money is under the stewardship of various earthly governments. (Matt. 22:16-22; Romans 13:7)
- 85. To avoid error, seek to know the Scriptures and the power of Yahweh. (Matt. 22:23-29; 2 Peter 3:17)
- 86. Obey those who speak the word that comes from Yahweh and do not follow the example of anyone who disobeys it. (Matt. 23:1-4; 15:2; Luke 11:37-39) DO YOU UNDERSTAND HOW FEW THAT IS?
- 87. Do not be called "Rabbi" or "Master/Teacher" and don't call anyone on earth your [spiritual] Father. (Matt. 23:4-8)
- 88. Do keep the finer points of the law, but without neglecting the weightier matters such as justice, mercy, faith, a true love for Yahweh and a true love for man. (Matt. 23:23-24)
- 89. Take heed that no one deceives you by leading you to a false Messiah/prophet, or a false teaching that we can disobey Yahweh's law. (Matt. 24:4-5) Such as in christianity, the falling away promised to come.
- 90. See to it that you are not troubled by world events prior to the end of this age. (Matt. 24:6-8)
- 91. If you are in Judea during the time of the abomination of desolation, flee to the mountains, and if you are on the housetop, don't go down to take anything out of your house, nor go back to get your clothes if you are in the field. (Matt. 24:14-18)
- 92. If you are in Judea, pray that your trek to the mountains isn't in the winter or on the Sabbath. (Matt. 24:14-10)
- 93. Learn the parable of the fig tree, when Yahshua's return is near. (Matt. 24:32-34)
- 94. Watch, be ready, and pray always that you are counted worthy to escape all the things that will come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man. (Matt. 24:42-44; Luke 21:33-36; Mark 13:33-37)
- 95. Take heed to yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and cares of this life, and that Day come on you unexpectedly. (Luke 23:34)
- 96. Be like men who wait for their master, when he will return from the wedding, that when he comes and knocks they may open to him immediately. (Luke 12:35-36)
- 97. Care for the physical and spiritual needs of Israylites around you. Otherwise, you are not one of His sheep, but a goat (Matthew 25), and given everlasting punishment rather than eternal life. (Matt. 25:31-46) 98. Keep your lamps burning with extra oil in your vessels by receiving the ministry of the Word as a lamp unto your feet, and receiving the ministry of the Messiah Yahshua in your life. Otherwise, He will not know you on the day of His return. (Matt. 25:1- John 6:63; 2 Corinthians 3:12-14)
- 99. Don't live by the sword, but by His Spirit. Thus, only use weapons if the Spirit of Yahweh leads you for the protection of life, but be willing to die for your faith. (Matt. 26:52; Luke 22:31-29)
- 100. Make disciples of all the people Israyl had developed into, including the descendants of the House of Israyl (The Northern Kingdom), baptizing them in the name of Yahshua, teaching them to observe all things that Yahshua commanded. (Matt. 28:18-20) A good research will show Matt. 28:19 likely altered to appeal to the false teaching of the trinity.
- 101. When sharing Yahweh's Word (seed) with others, remember that you can only care for Yahweh's garden by sowing seeds, watering and caring for the plant (person). Be loving and patient, for you can't make the seed grow into a fruitful plant, only Yahweh can make it grow. (Mark 4:26-29)
- 102. When doing ministry, make sure that you set aside some time to rest and recuperate. (Mark 6:31-32)
- 103. Do not worry about your life and whether your physical needs will be provided for. Seek first the Kingdom of Yahweh and His righteousness, and all of these things will be added to you. (Matt. 6:25-34)
- 104. When it comes to our giving and our service to Yahweh, give your best effort with what you have. He is more impressed with effort than with the actual end-result. (Mark 12:41-44)
- 105. Those who are sick need the Great Physician. Let your light shine before men and let Yahweh's Word sanctify you rather than going out completely of the world to resolve the sin in your life. (Matt. 5:16)
- 106. Observe the Sabbath in such a way that manifests the truth that the Sabbath was made for man rather than man being made for the Sabbath. (Luke 2:27-28)
- 107. A disciple is not above His teacher. Seek to be perfectly trained by Yahshua your teacher, and walk as

He walked, keeping Yahweh's commandments as He did. Then you will be like Yahshua your teacher. (Luke 6:40)

- 108. If we cast the enemy out of our lives or the lives of others, don't rejoice that the unclean spirits are subject to you, rejoice that your name is written in heaven. (Luke 10:17-20)
- 109. Be a neighbor to those who you would normally view as a stranger or one with whom there is animosity by serving them in their time of need, and by that fulfill the command in Leviticus 19:34 to love the stranger as yourself. (Luke 10:30-37) The context of such neighborly love is focused upon "THY PEOPLE", fellow Israyiltes. The Samaritans were part of the descendants of House of Israyl, "our father Jacob gave us this well". This is a descendant of the House of Israyl that found a Yahudite injured and helped him. "Strangers" are usually referring to Israylites that had came back from being separated from other Israylites for a long time, even generations. Not 'hottentots' and 'pygmies' or the other beasts of the field races.
- 110. When serving in ministry to Israylites, don't allow your serving to be a distraction away from the one thing that's most needed: Being regularly fed by the word of Yahweh. Don't fail to give attention to reading. (Luke 10:40)
- 111. Take heed that the light which is in you is not darkness, like with false gospels, false messiahs, false gospel like universalism. In whatever good thing that you are doing, it must be from a love for Yahweh and man in line with Yahweh's will and ways, or it is nothing. (Luke 11:35) Donating money to Edomites or beasts of the field is not in the will of Yahweh, for example.
- 112. Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy. For there is nothing covered that will not be revealed, nor hidden that will not be known. (Luke 12:1)
- 113. Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses. (Luke 12:15)
- 114. Do not fear, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom.
- 115. If you have possessions keeping you from putting Yahweh first, sell it and give alms; provide yourselves money bags which do not grow old, a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches nor moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Luke 12:33-34) 116. When faced with a legal situation such as a financial dispute, with an uncertain but potentially very
- troublesome outcome, try to settle out of court quickly. (Luke 12:58-59)
- 117. When judgment appears to fall on sinners, don't be high minded. Instead, be sure that you are bearing the fruits of repentance yourself. Sometimes Yahweh judges sinners to be a wakeup call for others who need to repent. (Luke 13:1-5)
- 118. Yahweh is very patient, but He does have a limit to the number of times He will try to call a person to repentance and faith in Yahshua, or allow one who claims to be a believer to not bear fruit. Hear His call. You don't know if He will call you again later in life. (Luke 13:24-30)
- 119. Don't exalt yourself in group settings, assuming too much for yourself. Be humble and allow others to take the best seat. (Luke 14:11)
- 120. Look for opportunities to bless those who are at a disadvantage, such as inviting the poor, the disabled, the fatherless or widow among true Israyl to dinner. They cannot repay, but Yahweh will repay you at the resurrection of the just. (Luke 14:12-14
- 121. Don't allow distractions in your life to pull you away from what's really important: Being sure that you are zealous for Yahweh's Spiritual food, spending time with Him, and being about our Father's business. This will show Him that you truly want to be at the Marriage Supper of the Lamb, no excuses. (Luke 14:15-22)
- 122. Don't just listen to Yahshua's teachings, become the salt of the earth by following those teachings, considering what you may lose in this world when deciding to do so: Friends, family, possessions, and even your own life. (Luke 14:34-34) Remember the message is to True Israyl.
- 123. Once we have confessed our sins and expressed a heart of contrition and brokenness over them, remember that we have expressed the kind of heart that Yahweh says He will save. Let Him revive your heart and give you the joy of salvation rather than remaining in that condition forever, lest you grow faint. Let the joy of Yahweh is your strength! (Luke 15)
- 124. The law and prophets prophesied the Kingdom of Yahweh would come. By Grace, unmerited favor, a gift of faith, will one receive Yahshua as King and walk as He walked, not by force or violence. Live your life accordingly. (Luke 16:16)

- 125. Remember that wealth is not always a blessing, for it can lead to a self-centered lifestyle where we do not care to hear the scriptures and the testimony of Yahshua. (Luke 16:19-31)
- 126. When you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do.' (Luke 17:7-10) "Be Ye Perfect ... as Your Father in heaven."
- 127. We can cry out for mercy when we are in difficult circumstances, but in everything we must give thanks. And if we are delivered, glorify Yahweh with thanksgiving, continuing to follow Yahshua ... even if no one else does. (Luke 17:38-43)
- 128. In faith, cry out day and night if you desire Yahweh to avenge and bring justice on your behalf. He will avenge you speedily. (Luke 18:1-8)
- 129. When you pray, come to Him in humility and genuine repentance for any sins you have committed rather than pridefully recalling your good deeds, and never compare your righteousness to others in your prayer. (Luke 18:9-14)
- 130. Show love to Israylite sinners rather than scowling at them from a high perch. Your kindness, love and grace can demonstrate what Yahshua has done for you, and may even save their soul. (Luke 19:1-10)
- 131. When repenting, let Yahweh lead you in how to bring forth the fruits of repentance. Sometimes that may involve practicing the opposite behavior of what you were doing before, at levels that may not be required of others. Doing this may even help you overcome. (Luke 19:8-10)
- 132. If you are in a position of leadership, focus on serving others by meeting their needs and setting an example of what you expect of them rather than sitting back and just firing off orders, expecting to be served. (Luke 22:24-27)
- 133. Believe in Yahshua's death and resurrection and you will be born of the water and Spirit, inheriting eternal life. He will give you the Holy Spirit to live a Spirit-filled life of keeping His commandments, leading you to the ultimate rebirth at your resurrection: an incorruptible Spiritual body. (John 3:3)
- 134. To worship Yahweh in Spirit and truth, receive Yahshua the Messiah to receive the Holy Spirit, and then walk in the Spirit by pursuing obedience to the Word, the Torah of Yahweh. (John 4:23-24)
- 135. Yahweh the Father gave Yahshua the ability to have life in Himself, give life to whom He will, committed all judgment to the Son, is one with the Father, and did many mighty works in Him. Honor Yahshua, even as you honor the Father. If anyone doesn't honor the Son, he fails to honor the Father who sent Him.
- 136. Do more than just search the Scriptures to find truth. Come to Yahshua with a true and loyal heart toward Yahweh so that you might have life. (John 5:39)
- 137. Make sure that you aren't following "another",... like the false messiah Jesus Christ The Man of Sin that sits in the "temple" (body/mind) exalted as if he is Yahweh, ... by living differently than Yahshua lived. (John 5:43)
- 138. When sharing the Word, let it be from Yahweh's oracles rather than from yourself, so that He is glorified rather than man. (John 7:16-18)
- 139. Do not judge according to appearance, but judge with righteous judgment. (John 7:24)
- 140. If anyone spiritually thirsts, come to Yahshua and drink, calling upon the name of Yahweh. Then with joy you will drink of His Spirit from the wells of salvation, and you will rejoice. (John 7:37-39, Isaiah 12:2-6)
- 141. Abide in Yahshua's words by walking as He walked and putting your trust in Him for the forgiveness of sin. Then the truth will set you free through Yahshua the Messiah. (John 8:31-36)
- 142. If you want to know the truth and understand Yahshua's words, you must walk in righteousness rather than a spirit of slander/murder. (John 8:37-45)
- 143. Never put confidence in your physical heritage, the flesh, as having any bearing on whether you are accepted by Yahweh or not. We all need to walk the Yahshua walk. (John 8:33-40)
- 144. Beware of hireling or self-serving pastors and wolves in sheep's clothing who in any way disregard even one actual scripture, whether it be in the "Old Testament" or New Testament." Yahshua's sheep hear His voice in the holy scriptures, recognize His loving and protective leadership style in the Spirit, and follow. (John 10:1-16). The other flock? He came to House of Yahudah first, where he was predominantly rejected and murdered. BUT, as per promise, it was descendants of the House of Israyl who were turned to at the end of the 70 weeks prophecy with the stoning of Stephen in Acts 7. Acts 8 is where Philip goes into Samaria to minister to those descendants of the House of Israyl.
- 145. If you are called to be a Pastor/Shepherd, never allow money or personal benefit to be a motivator. Imitate the Good Shepherd by serving them, protecting them from spiritual wolves, and sharing the words

- of the Good Shepherd, thus feeding the flock with good spiritual food (Genesis to Revelation). (John 10:12-15; 21:15-17)
- 146. Prior to partaking of Yahshua at Passover, wash one another's feet, for Messiah said, "I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you." (John 13:15)
- 147. Love one another as Yahshua loves us, then all will know that we are His disciples. (John 13:34-35)
- 148. If you fall into some kind of serious sin, do not become bitter against yourself, allowing your heart to remain troubled and embittered. Repent, believe in Yahshua, and He will prepare a place for you—that you may be with Him forever. (John 14:1-4)
- 149. Abide in Yahshua and show love to Him and our Heavenly Father by keeping His commandments, then you will be loved by Yahweh the Father, He will send you His Spirit, and He and the Messiah Yahshua will make you their home. (John 14:15-15:14)
- 150. Receive the peace (shalom) that comes through Yahshua by choosing thanksgiving and faith in His Word rather than fear, love rather than division, trusting in Him for the forgiveness of sin, setting our minds on spiritual things, loving and heeding His commandments, and knowing that Yahshua has already overcome the world. (John 14:25-27; 16:33, Romans 8:6-7, Philippians 4:6-7, 2 Peter 3:13-14, Psalm 4:6-8; 119:165, Isaiah 26:34; 48:17-18)
- 151. Prayers should go to the Father in Yahshua's Name, but it is permissible to talk to Yahshua. He lives in the Remnant of true genetic Israyl. (John 14:14; 16:22-23. Psalm 45:6-7, Acts 7:59-60, Acts 9:3-21)
- 152. If the world hates you, know that it hated Yahshua before it hated you. But because you were chosen out of the world, and because of His name, the world hates you. (John 15:18-21)
- 153. If you keep Yahshua's words/commands, you must keep the words/commands of His disciples also. (Luke 16:10:16; John 15:20)
- 154. Seek oneness the Father, so that Yahshua's desire for us to have oneness with one another will come. (John 17:20-21)
- 155. Walk as Yahshua walked by declaring the written and spoken name of Yahweh. (John 17:6,26)
- 156. Remember that no one can harm us unless Yahweh allows it. He will use it for our benefit, and His glory in the end. (John 19:10-11)
- 157. Focus not on when Yahshua will return, for the Father has put that in His own authority. Focus on being a witness for Yahshua to fellow Israylites and living as He called us to live when it does. (Acts 1:7-8) 158. Remember to not take it so personally when you are being persecuted for your faith and obedience, for they are actually persecuting Yahshua. You are members of His body, of His flesh and bones. (Acts 9:5) 159. Don't neglect to evangelize people that you assume are too evil (unclean) to be saved. (Acts 10:1-11:19)
- 160. Remember the words of Yahshua, "it is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35)
